CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS Cut fabrics in order given.

A. Pattern #16934 – WHI1

(Focal #1, white with black flowers)

1. Cut two 8" x 42" strips. Crosscut into six 8" squares.

B. Pattern #16934 – BLA1

(Focal #2, black with white flowers)

1. Cut two 8" x 42" strips. Crosscut into eight 8" squares.

C. Pattern #16934 - RED1

(Focal #3, red with white flowers)

1. Cut two 8" x 42" strips. Crosscut into ten 8" squares.

- D. Pattern #16935 BLA1 (black and white stripe)
 - 1. Cut six $1^3/4$ " x 42" strips for the inner border.
- E. Pattern #16936 LTRED1 (white with red dots)
 - 1. Cut two $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips.
 - 2. Cut one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strip. Crosscut into eight $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- F. Pattern #16936 BLA1 (black with white dots)
 - 1. Cut six $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips.
 - 2. Cut two $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x 42" strips. Crosscut into twenty-four $2^{1}/_{2}$ " squares.
- G. Pattern #16936 WHI1 (white with black dots)
 - 1. Cut eight $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips.
 - 2. Cut two $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x 42" strips. Crosscut into thirty-two $2^{1}/_{2}$ " squares.
- H. Pattern #16936 DKRED1 (red with white dots)
 - 1. Cut four $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips.
 - 2. Cut one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strip. Crosscut into sixteen $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- I. Pattern #16936 RED1 (red with black dots)
 - 1. Cut four $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips.
 - 2. Cut one $2^{1}/_{2}$ " x 42" strip. Crosscut into sixteen $2^{1}/_{2}$ " squares.
- J. Pattern #16936 MUL1 (black with red dots)
- 1. Cut eight $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips for binding.
- K. Pattern #16937 RED1 (red diamonds)
 - 1. Cut three $2^3/4$ " x 42" strips. Crosscut into four $2^3/4$ " x 8" rectangles and four $2^3/4$ " x $12^1/2$ " rectangles.


L. Pattern #16938 – RED1 (small red and white floral)

- 1. Cut seven $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 42" strips. Crosscut into twelve $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 8" rectangles and twelve $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 12 $^{1}/_{2}$ " rectangles.
- M. Pattern #16938 MUL1 (small black and white floral)
 - 1. Cut five $2^3/4^{11} \times 42^{11}$ strips. Crosscut into eight $2^3/4^{11} \times 8^{11}$ rectangles and eight $2^3/4^{11} \times 12^1/2^{11}$ rectangles.
- N. Pattern #16940 DKRED1 (red with large black dots)
 - 1. Cut seven $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips for outer border.
- O. Pattern #16941 BLA1 (black and white wallpaper)
 - 1. Cut five $2^3/4^{\circ}$ x 42° strips. Crosscut into eight $2^3/4^{\circ}$ x 8° rectangles and eight $2^3/4^{\circ}$ x $12^4/2^{\circ}$ rectangles.
- P. Pattern #16941 DKRED1 (black and red wallpaper)
 - 1. Cut nine $2^3/_4$ " x 4^2 " strips. Crosscut into sixteen $2^3/_4$ " x 8" rectangles and sixteen $2^3/_4$ " x $12^1/_2$ " rectangles.

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

- **A. Make the block center:** Refer to the Cutting Instructions to identify pieces listed in parenthesis below.
- Q1. Make two with red focal square (C). Corners are white with red dots (E.2).
- **Q2.** Make eight with red focal square (C). Corners are white with black dots (G.2).
- **Q3.** Make four with black focal square (B). Corners are red with white dots (H.2).
- **Q4.** Make four with black focal square (B). Corners are red with black dots (I.2).
- **Q5.** Make six with white focal square (A). Corners are black with white dots (F.2).
- ❖ To add the corners to Focal Unit Q, sew the 2½" squares along the diagonal as follows:

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each 2½" square. Place a square of the same fabric on each corner of the focal fabric, right sides together, with the diagonal lines positioned as shown (Figure 1). Stitch on each diagonal line. Trim ½" away from the line. Press toward the outside of the unit. Repeat to make twenty-four Focal Units.




Sew on line. Figure 1



Trim and press.


B. Add the curved units:

- **R1.** Make two with red focal square (Q1). Semicircles (E.1) and corners (E.2) are white with red dots. Background is red diamonds (K).
- **R2.** Make eight with red focal square (Q2). Semicircles (G.1) and corners (G.2) are white with black dots. Background is black and red wallpaper (P).
- **R3.** Make four with black focal square (Q3). Semicircles (H.1) and corners (H.2) are red with white dots. Background is small black and white floral (M).

- R4. Make four with black focal square (Q4). Semicircles (I.1) and corners (I.2) are red with black dots. Background is black and white wallpaper (O).
- R5. Make six with white focal square (Q5). Semicircles (F.1) and corners (F.2) are black with white dots. Background is small red and white floral (L).



Focal Block R Finished block size: 12"

- Construct curved units using freezer paper appliqué
 - 1. Trace appliqué Templates 1 and 2 onto freezer paper, at least eight times each. Cut freezer paper along the traced lines.

Tip: The freezer paper templates can be reused several times.

- 2. Use the 2³/₄" polka dot strips for the curved appliqué. For each strip, press two freezer paper Templates 1 and two freezer paper Templates 2 to the wrong side of the polka dot fabric. Align the edge of the freezer paper templates with the edge of the fabric strip, and leave at least $\frac{1}{2}$ " between the templates.
- 3. Cut the polka dot fabric approximately 1/4" from the curved edge of the templates as shown in Figure 2.

4. Press the curved edges of the polka dot fabric over the freezer paper (Figure 3).



Tip: Brush a small amount of starch on the curved edge before pressing to help the fabric hold the crease. Spray the starch

❖ Make the following quantities of Appliqué 1 and Appliqué 2:

into a small cup in order to apply with a brush.

White with red dots (E.1): four of each (Appliqué 1 and Appliqué 2)

White with black dots (G.1): sixteen of each Red with white dots (H.1): eight of each Red with black dots (I.1): eight of each Black with white dots (F.1): twelve of each

5. Remove freezer paper from Appliqué 1. Pin or baste to the $2^{3}/_{4}$ " x 8" rectangles of background fabric (Figure 4). Refer to B., R1-R5, to Figure 4 make the correct semicircle and background combinations. Hand or machine appliqué in place.

C. Finish the Block R construction:



1. Sew Appliqué Unit 1 to the top and bottom of Unit Q using a 1/4" seam allowance (Figure 5).

- 2. Press toward the block center (Figure 6).
- 3. Remove freezer paper from Appliqué 2. Note: Each Appliqué 2 will be appliquéd after the backgrounds have been sewn to the blocks. Pin appliqué to the sides of the unit (Figure 7), right sides




together, and matching the curve of Appliqué 1. Place the 43/4" x 121/2" rectangle of back-ground fabric, with the right

side of the background fabric facing the wrong side of the appliqué (Figure 8). Pin, and sew, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the center of the block. Hand or machine appliqué in place.

Note: For each block, the appliqué fabric should be the same as the corner fabric of the Focal Unit, and the background fabric of the Appliqué Units should be the same as the other background fabrics used.




QUILT ASSEMBLY:


Refer to Figure 9 on preceding page.

- 1. Quilt Center: Arrange blocks into six rows of four blocks each as shown. Sew blocks together into rows. Press. Sew rows together to complete the quilt center. Press.
- 2. Inner Border: Sew all of the 1³/₄" (D) inner border strips together end to end. Press seams open. Measure the length of the quilt down the middle. Cut two lengths from the joined strips equal to that length. Sew to the long sides of the quilt center. Press toward D. Measure the width of the quilt across the middle. Cut two lengths from the joined strips equal to that measurement. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward D.
- **3. Outer Border:** Follow the directions for the inner border to attach the outer border.

FINISHING:

- 1. Prepare backing fabric to measure 69" x 93" using a vertical seam.
- 2. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing.
- 3. Baste layers together.
- 4. Hand or machine quilt as desired.
- 5. Trim the batting and backing even with the quilt top.
- 6. Join the binding strips with diagonal seams. Attach binding using your favorite method.
- 7. Make a hanging sleeve (optional) and a label. Attach to the back of the quilt.





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
